- 2) Describe how the professor responded to the children. How do you think you would have responded?
- 3) In what ways do you think you can be more open to magical or mystical things that cannot be explained?
- 4) Discuss how the children need to lean on trust and surrender to guide them in Narnia. What ways can you lean into faith when you're not quite sure?
- 5) "Course he isn't safe. But he's good. He's the King, I tell you." Discuss this quote.

Reflection Questions:

- 1) Think about how the group responded at the mention of Aslan's name (page 74). How do you respond when you hear the name of Jesus?
- 2) What parts of your life have been turned to stone and need the warmth of God to restore them back to life?
- 3) What sources of wisdom do you have to speak truth in your life and affirm your identity as royalty of the Kingdom?
